Approving of a formula grant application for the Family Violence Prevention & Services
Act (FVSPA) Domestic Violence Shelter & Supportive Services/Grants to Native
American Tribes and Tribal Organizations

- WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziíbi Daáwaa Anišhinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on July 11, 2016 which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on August 24, 2016; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), Administration for Children & Families (ACF), Administration on Children, Youth & Families (ACFY), Family & Youth Services Bureau (FYSB) has extended a formula-driven funding opportunity to tribes in order to 1) to increase public awareness about primary and secondary prevention of family violence, domestic violence, domestic violence, and dating violence; and 2) to provide immediate shelter & supportive services for victims of family violence, domestic violence, or dating violence and their dependents (42 U.S.C. 10401(b)(1)-(2)).

- WHEREAS, the Tribe is an eligible applicant i.e., Little River Band of Ottawa Indians is a federally-recognized tribal government with a Victim Services Program; and
- WHEREAS, Little River Band of Ottawa Indians Family Services Department representatives have reviewed this funding opportunity, and recommended that it be pursued in order to help better meet the needs of tribal member and/or victims of family violence; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe's elected leaders hereby concur with the pursuit of these ends in order to improve the social and emotional outcomes of family violence victims.
- NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOVLED, that the Tribal Council approves the submission of the formula-based grant application to receive a Family Violence Prevention and Services/ Domestic Violence Shelter and Supportive Services/Grants to Native American Tribes and Tribal Organizations award
