Approval to Submit to United States Department of Housing and Urban Development(HUD), the FY2022 Indian Housing Plan for the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians as developed by the Housing Department

- WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziíbi Daáwaa Aníšhinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on July 11, 2016 which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on August 24, 2016; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe is required to submit a Tribal Indian Housing Plan to HUD on an annual basis, the submittal of which provides HUD the basis of allocating NAHASDA (Native American Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Act) funding through the Indian Housing Block Grant (IHBG); and
- WHEREAS, this submittal is due to HUD (U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development) no later than October 18, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the FY2022 Indian Housing Plan also provides both activity and budget plans for the goals and objectives specifically identified within the plan and these goals and objectives are allowable activities through NAHASDA and do serve the long term interest of the Housing Department, the Tribe and its Citizens. The Housing Department readied this submission to HUD which was reviewed by the Tribal Ogema's Office and finally by the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians Tribal Council and found to be in accordance with the long term interests of the Tribe in terms of its HUD funded housing related activities.

IT IS NOW THEREFORE RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians whereby approves the submission of the 2022 Indian Housing Plan to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development for FY 2022.
