- Ratification of Jack Doheny Company Contract to purchase a Vactor / Jetter Single Engine Sewer Cleaner with Positive Displacement Vacuum System Truck
- WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziíbi Daáwaa Aníšhinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on July 11, 2016 which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on August 24, 2016; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is vested with the authority, under Article IV, Section 7(b), to ratify contracts to be entered into by the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, Tribe Council supports the need to purchase a vactor/ jetter truck during COVID19 or other pandemic like occurrences; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has received a contract from Jack Doheny Company in the amount of \$460,960.00 for the protection of the public health and protection of the environment. Through a joint effort with MSU, test results show varying degrees of Covid 19, Delta and UK variant that are present in the wastewater. The truck will be utilized to clean sewer lines and pumping stations as well as assisting in repair of any future breaks in sewer lines; and

WHEREAS, either CARES or ARPA funding can be used to pay for this project; and

WHEREAS, the contract has been reviewed by LRBOI Unified Legal, Rebecca Liebing; and

WHEREAS, nothing in this Contract shall be construed to be a waiver of the sovereign immunity of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians or any of its subordinate enterprises or entities and

WHEREAS, Venue for any dispute arising out of this Contract shall be the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians Tribal Court. This Contract, and any disputes arising out of this Contract, shall be governed by the laws of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians.

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians hereby authorizes the Tribal Ogema to execute the Agreement with Jack Doheny Company for the sum of \$460,960.00 using CARES and/or ARPA funding, and incorporating the contents of this resolution.

CERTIFICATE OF ADOPTION
