RESOLUTION 99-0422- 03

ADOPTION OF HOUSING ROAD MAINTENANCE PLAN AND COMMITMENT OF ANNUAL INDIAN HOUSING BLOCK GRANT FUNDS FOR NECESSARY MAINTENANCE ACTIVITIES

WHEREAS, The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians status as a federally recognized Indian tribe was reaffirmed and restored by Congress pursuant to Public Law 103-324, 108 Stat. 2156(25 U.S.C. Sec. 1300k et seq.)(hereinafter "Little River Act"); and

WHEREAS, The Tribe and its members are eligible for all services and benefits provided by the federal government to Indians, as reaffirmed by P.L. 103-324, because of their status as enrolled members of a federally recognized tribe; and

WHEREAS, The Tribal Council, pursuant to Article IV, Section 1 of the Constitution of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians ("Tribal Constitution"), is authorized to regulate the governmental and economic affairs of the Tribe and to ratify agreements and contracts between the Tribe and federal government; and

WHEREAS, The Tribal Ogema, pursuant to Article V, Section 5 of the Tribal Constitution, is authorized to represent the Tribe in its relations with other organizations, in a manner consistent with the Tribal Constitution; and

WHEREAS, The Tribal Council is authorized to contract for federal funds under the authority of the Indian Self-Determination Act (P.L. 93-638, as amended), and to implement and administer services for its members; and

WHEREAS, The Native American Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Act authorizes the governing body of the Tribe to appoint, select, or designate a Tribally Designated Housing Entity (TDHE) for the purposes of administering, and operating a tribal housing program; and

WHEREAS, The Tribal Council has under its Housing Ordinance, designated the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians Housing Commission as its TDHE to administer a broad range of housing programs, including those programs funded by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for low income Tribal members and other programs as may become available; and

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians has reviewed and hereby approves a Housing Road Maintenance Plan and specifically confirms the commitment of annual Indian Housing Block Grant Funds in the amount of \$ 3,000 for necessary road maintenance activities.

CERTIFICATION

OTTAWA INDIANS HOUSING FACILITY MAINTENANCE PLANS INFRASTRUCTURE - PERIME OF ROADS

ROUTINE MAINTENANCE

- * Patching and repairing roadway surface of bituminous concrete, brick, or asphalt
- * Placing new aggregate on an existing gravel or stone surface to replace original material worn off.
- * Reconditioning of bituminous surfaces of any length section by scarifying and remixing, or resurfacing without scarifying when new material is added which increases the existing bituminous surface less than 3/4 inch.
- * Cleaning of ditches and drainage structures.
- * Dust layers, sprinkling and flushing.
- * Brushing and tree trimming.
- * Retracing pavement markings.
- * Snow and ice removal.
- * Replacement in kind, or repair of traffic signs, deline was and traffic signals.

COST OF MAINTENANCE

Reconditioning, repair, and patching \$2,500 pc are (5,280.00 feet in a mile)

Snow & ice removal \$500.00 c month of increment weather
