The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians held an Emergency Meeting at the Little River Band Government Center on June 17, 2016. Following are the minutes of that meeting that were taken from the Roll Call Record.

A. Authorizing the Tribal Ogema's Execution of a Letter of Agreement and a Letter of Commitment with the Grand Traverse Band of Ottawa and Chippewa Indians, the Michigan Court Improvement Program, the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, the Grand Traverse County Prosecuting Attorney, Michigan State University College of Law, and the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians to collaboratively apply for the FY 2016 State and Tribal Indian Child Welfare Act Implementation Partnership Grant offered by the Department of Health and Human Services Administration for Children and Families

This Agreement will allow the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians to take part in improving outcomes for Native American Families in Michigan by increasing Indian Child Welfare Act compliance rates in State Court proceedings, expediting Indian Child Welfare Act Notices to Tribes through the use of technology, educating State Courts on the Indian Child Welfare Act, and evaluating the impacts of the developed model.

Jason Cross, Director of Family Services, represented this agenda item. Cross said these are the Letter of Agreement and the Letter of Commitment being signed by the Ogema will allow the Tribe to participate in this five year \$1.4 million grant to improve how the ICWA System worked in the State of Michigan and would allow this Tribe to sit at the table and make decisions and would also allow them to be a demonstration site to design and implement those projects that come out of this grant.

Councilor Medacco asked when does this letter have to be signed.
