1. Approval of Submission Application of FY2016 Revision to the FY2015-2016 Performance Partnership Grant to add Environmental Protection Agency-Clean Water Act Sections 319 Funding to FY2016

This added revision will increase the award for the EPA Funding in 2016.

Allison Smart, from the Natural Resource Department, represented this agenda item along with Frank Beaver, Natural Resource Department Director. Smart said today they have brought forth for them a resolution to approve the submission of a grant application to the United States Environmental Protection Agency as part of their Performance Partnership Grant for a revision of their FY2015/2016 Performance Partnership Grant to add Clean Water Act Section 319 Non-Point Source Pollution Funds for this fiscal year.

Councilor Burger asked Allison Smart if she could kind of tell the Tribal Membership in attendance how this will help benefit them as citizens.

Allison Smart said yes, 319 Non-Point Source Pollution Funds enable them to work with Watershed Groups to improve things like road-stream crossings to prevent pollution from entering their watershed in the Manistee River. Smart said it gives them the ability to help educate members, farmers, and work on Tribal Lands as well to decrease the amount of non-point source such as their run-off from agriculture into the watershed.

Figgels said he is bringing to them now as he likes to get that in advance of the drop dead date, so to speak. Figgels said they appreciate it also because it gives them an opportunity to review their report should they have a question on it they can make any adjustments as necessary before the final date that it has to be submitted.

C. Approval of 2016 Regulations for Lake Sturgeon Harvest on Black Lake

The Regulations were passed by motion at the Natural Resource Commission Meeting on March 14, 2016 and are now ready for approval by Tribal Council for the 2016 Lake Sturgeon Harvest.

Corey Jerome, from the Natural Resource Department, represented this agenda item. Jerome said at the March 14th Meeting of the Natural Resource Commission they approved the 2016 Regulations for Lake Sturgeon Harvest on Black Lake and it is in front of them today for their approval. Jerome reiterated it is for Black Lake Sturgeon Harvest in accordance with the Inland Consent Decree.

Acting Recorder Di Piazza asked what the total of fish is.

Corey Jerome said the total fish for this year is two fish.

Councilor Burger said out of the whole lake.

Corey Jerome responded right.

Acting Recorder Di Piazza said the fish are big.

Fran Pitts asked from the audience where Black Lake was.

Speaker Johnson said it is up near Torch Lake and near the top of the Mitt.

Councilor Burger said it is just west of Rogers City way up in the northeast corner of the Mitt.

Johnson said this is somewhat related to the Sturgeon Harvest but they have guests in the room here and asked Corey Jerome being that he is their Sturgeon person maybe he could give them.....or give the people in the audience a quick overview of what they are doing with the Sturgeon here in Manistee.

Corey Jerome said yes he can, they have doing a Rehabilitation Program on the Manistee River for the past......since 2004 collecting eggs and larval fish. Jerome said they have been rearing them on a streamside Rearing Facility during the summer and then doing a Release Ceremony in the fall of those fish to help

rehabilitate the population here on the Manistee River. Jerome said they will be looking at doing that again here this spring.

Councilor Burger asked how many total have they released.

Corey Jerome said they have released just over a 1,000 fish in that timeframe.

Speaker Johnson asked Corey Jerome when he felt they are going to start revisiting into the river system.

Corey Jerome replied that the adults should be......some of the males will be coming back here in the next few years around 13-14 years of age some of the males are going to start returning. Jerome said they will be looking to assess that soon.

- B. Ogema Weekly Status and Business Update

Ogema Romanelli said he has just a couple of updates today. Romanelli said he wanted to welcome everybody here today along with their visitors. Romanelli said it is really nice visitors and thinks they should have them more often because they were done at 23 minutes after ten as opposed to what Jay Sam said that there was four day meeting they used to have in the old days so they kind of cut it down just a bit. Romanelli said to Jay Sam thanks to giving them a four day deal but they just got it done in 23 minutes and he doesn't know if they are getting less business done or they are just faster than they were in the day. Romanelli said who knows but yes. Romanelli said he thinks it is important because he really appreciates the visitors being here today and if Jason Cross or the visitors could name who they are and where they are coming from. Romanelli said he knows they are all busy and he really appreciates them taking the time out of their day. Romanelli asked Jason Cross if he wanted to try that and not to put him on the spot but really thinks it is important.

Katelyn Richard said hello and she is the current Assistant Director of Baker College.

Michelle Graves said she is the Editor of Manistee News Advocate.

Kaci Kamaloski said she is the CFO for Filer Credit Union.

Tina Miller said she is the Chief Officer of Westshore Medical Center.

Stacie Bytwork said she is the Executive Director for the Manistee Area Chamber of Commerce.

Darrell Lavender said he was the Vice President of Westshore Medical Center.

Crystal Young said she is the Director of the ____ Opportunities Center at Westshore Community College.

John Scott said he is the Pastor of the Manistee United Methodist Church.

Kay Salyer said she is the Director of General Ed at the Manistee ISD.

Ron Stoneman said he is here from Stone House and is the Superintendent of Manistee Schools.

Ogema Romanelli said that is how busy they are and there are always two things going. Romanelli thanked them and said he appreciated them being here and for introducing themselves. Romanelli said he doesn't much on his part. Romanelli said he met with several departments just last week and he appreciates the Directors meeting with him along with explaining what was going on in their departments. Romanelli said they are trying to get a little bit more communication going between the departments and inter-departments along with it. Romanelli said he thinks they are going to do okay. Romanelli said he had some of the Leads going around with him and he appreciates all that. Romanelli said he appreciates the Legal Department also doing what they are doing to try and help facilitate all of this. Romanelli said they have one on the road and one here today. Romanelli said he thanks them very much. Romanelli said he thinks that is all he has.

Speaker Johnson said he would just like to add something to this for their Chamber of Commerce. Johnson said he invites them to sign their register if they haven't done it. Johnson said the reason why he asks that is because their Secretary who is taking the minutes and the Recorder sometimes does not pick up the names and he wanted to make sure they are put in the minutes the presence of their Chamber of Commerce. Johnson reiterated that if they haven't signed in on the log, please, he invites them to do that before they leave here. Johnson said also he wanted to, on the business end, on this building itself as they walk in and he doesn't know if Jay Sam brought it to their attention or Jason Cross they have their Seven Teachings as Jay Sam spoke about. Johnson said they are listed on the walls and it reminds them as Tribal members on how they behave as human

beings especially when they get into these meetings like this to be respectful and honest, etc. Johnson said they are listed up there and he invites them to take a look at that also. Johnson asked if there was anything else under Business Update.

B. Legislative Affairs Update

Councilor Burger said the only thing that she would let the membership know is Councilor Lewis is travelling out tomorrow to deliver the testimony for the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians before the United States House of Representatives Subcommittee on Appropriations Department of Interior Environment related agencies. Burger said she is very happy to have help to collaborate on the testimony because there were some last minute changes. Burger said originally she was going to do that but she has had a family emergency because she has a teenager who likes to ride skateboards and sometimes gravity doesn't work well with teenagers and skateboards so she is really happy that Councilor Lewis stepped up and agreed to do it. Burger said they identified some areas that she really felt very passionate about and wanting to bring forth before the committee. Burger said one of the areas is Tribal Historic Preservation and the other area is their Natural Resources in particular their Ricing Program. Burger said she wanted to talk about their Healthcare Delivery System and how they are expanding care to include Pharmacy Services in this fiscal year. Burger said there is a little bit about education and a little bit about their language and culture. Burger said she thinks that overall everything that they wrote in the testimony bears the priorities of the Tribe and she has to say that this is the opportunity that Tribes take to bring those priorities forward and hopefully they see it reflected in Budgets, Subsequent Presidential Budgets and Subsequent Adoptions by Congress. Burger said last year one of the things that she was talking to Councilor Lewis about was there was a lot of discussion because the suicide rate in Indian Country for adolescents is extremely high and is five times the national average. Burger said when you look at groups across the board Native American Youth have the highest incidents of suicide. Burger said one of the things that happened in the Budget and many of them talked about those rates, the lack of service providers, and the challenges they have funding interventions to make an impact on their at risk youth. Burger said one of the things she said in her testimony last year was she thought it needed to be a line item in the Budget. Burger said she thought the President needed to put forward a line item to address at risk youth and the challenges that Indian Country has and in the 2016 Budget he did it. Burger said Generation I and they call it Gen I is now a line item in the Bureau of Indian Affairs Budget. Burger said she didn't do that but many of them talked about it but the fact that they all came together with the same message had a result and the one government approached to addressing the youth suicide rates and the challenges of at risk youth in Indian Country came to the forefront in many Budgets and Operating Divisions they would never think of so it works when they go before those folks in DC and they spread their message it works. Burger said so way to go Councilor Lewis.

Councilor Lewis said she just wanted to say "thank you" to Councilor Burger for all her assistance and this is going to be a new experience for her and she is very excited. Lewis reiterated her thanks for all Councilor Burger's help in walking her through the protocol and explaining it to her.

Councilor Burger said absolutely and that Councilor Lewis was going to do fine.

Councilor Crampton said on that note there was......the Budget was submitted by President Obama and it is 13.4 billion dollars for the Department of the Interior and is 61 million dollar increase over last year. Crampton said the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the BIA will see 137 million increase for a total of 2.9 billon. Crampton said the problem is that even though this is......sounds like a lot of money it doesn't even begin to impact what they lost during Sequestration. Crampton said the Ogema and he went out in 2013 to speak about Sequestration. Crampton said Sequestration impacted Indian Country but what the Federal Government failed to realize is they are not bound by their Budgetary Constraints. Crampton said the money they owe them is based on Treaty Obligations and it is like almost calling somebody like an Electric Company saying they have a Budget and they can't pay their bill. Crampton said okay they are going to turn their electric off. Crampton said they are obligated to pay that money and is not based on their Budgetary Constraints. Crampton said this is a huge increase but like he said Councilor Lewis needs to remind them this is based on Treaty Obligations.

Councilor Burger said it is in there.

Speaker Johnson said he just wanted to quickly announce that through Robert Memberto-ba initiative on the Sewer Project they established a relationship with the local Units of Government and they are going to meet tomorrow to discuss various items. Johnson said one of the things they are going to be talking about is the north and south corridor developments and Filer Township has a new member joining them in this Units of Governments Meeting. Johnson said he is looking forward to that.

C. Public Comment Period

Eric Burke said he is not a Tribal member but wanted to take the opportunity to introduce himself. Burke said he is new to Indian Health Services and he will be covering Little River Band and he just wanted to say hello. Burke said just so they had a face with the name. Burke said he is working with the Tribe right now and down here actually on work. Burke said he saw that they were meeting and wanted to come over and say hello. Burke said for a little background he has lived in this area for a long time and actually has done work for the Tribe whether they know it or not. Burke said he is eager to continue that relationship and just wanted to remind them that although their primary focus is homes, Indian Homes and Service, they are available across the board as far as technical assistance. Burke said so just don't be shy about it he guessed.

Councilor Burger asked Eric Burke what division he works with like in OH and E.

Eric Burke replied yep, he is out of the Sault Ste. Marie Office so if they knew Mike O'Shay or Dan Wallace he is filling those shoes.

Councilor Burger said working with......

Eric Burke said sanitation. Burke said like he said they are not limited to that but a lot of their funding is. Burke said right now they had some EPA money available for the Wastewater Plant and some of their needs.

The purpose of closed session is to discuss business matters considered privileged or confidential involving consideration of bids/contracts, pending legal issues, and/or personnel matters.
