Resolution NRC-2025-0106-001

Emergency Resolution

to Adopt extending antierless deer season till the 12th of January 2025 in our 1836 treaty area in the units open per the state map

- WHEREAS, the status of the Gaá Čhing Ziíbi Daávaa Anishinaábek (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and a treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV. Section 7(a) of the Constitution to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(f) of the Constitution to create by ordinance regulatory commissions and to delegate to those commission the power to manage the affairs of the Little River Band; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council did by Ordinance #06-500-01 create the Natural Resource Commission to be a regulatory body and delegated to that Commission the power to oversee and regulate the use of the natural resources within its jurisdiction; and
- WHEREAS, per Natural Resources Commission Ordinance 6.02.e: To adopt, when deemed necessary by the Commission, such emergency regulations not to exceed 90 days in duration, including, but not limited to, restrictions on seasons, bag or creel limits, or method of harvest, as may be necessary to protect fish, wildlife and plant populations or other natural resources.
- NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED, the Natural Resources Commission adopts to extend the taking of antlerless deer till January 12th 2025 in our 1836 treaty area in the units open per the state map copies of the Regulation will be made available to the Public Safety Department and Natural Resources Department and posted on-line and available for Tribal Members.
- NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED. In a Special Meeting the Commission, Adopts emergency regulations not to exceed 90 days in duration, including, but not limited to, restrictions on seasons, bag or creel limits, or method of harvest, as may be necessary to protect fish, wildlife, and plant.


CERTIFICATION OF ADOPTION
