WHEREAS, the surveillance digital system requires properly functioning equipment to operate and due to aging equipment, cameras needs to be replaced; and

WHEREAS, the Surveillance Department budget does include funds to cover this expenditure and a quote was obtained from North American Video for the purchase of video equipment in the Amount of \$4,420.00; and

WHEREAS, the preferred vendor (sole source) for the purchase of this equipment is North American Video based on the fact that these cameras will be compatible with the other equipment within the department that has been purchased through North American Video; and

WHEREAS, the Tribe's status as a federally-recognized Indian tribe was reaffirmed and restored by Congress pursuant to Public Law 103-324, 108 Stat. 2156 (25 U.S.C.§ 1300k et seq.); and

WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and

WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and

WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on July 11, 2016 which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on August 24, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has, pursuant to Gaming Commission Ordinance #04-400-04, created a Gaming Commission and delegated to such Commission the authority to regulate all gaming activities authorized by the Tribe and to enforce all Tribal and federal laws governing the conduct of Tribally-licensed gaming activities; and

WHEREAS, Section 6.04 (a) of the Gaming Commission Ordinance permits the Gaming Commission to promulgate regulations and internal operational procedures of the Gaming Commission and its staff; and

WHEREAS, the Gaming Commission approved at its January 24, 2006 Gaming Commission meeting the Employee Licensing Procedure which establishes a procedure to clearly outline the process for the systematic collection, organization, and reporting of objective, factual information regarding an applicant's or licensee's past conduct and behavior which will be used to determine suitability for a Gaming or a Non-Gaming License; and

WHEREAS, the Employee Licensing Procedure was revised and approved by the Gaming Commission on December 12, 2013 and a recent review of the procedure indicated a need to make revisions to allow for a more efficient method of operation.

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED THAT the Gaming Commission hereby approves the Employee Licensing Procedure and deems it in effect immediately.

GAMING COMMISSION ORDER #GC17-0117-01

PROHIBITING LITTLE RIVER CASINO RESORT FROM CONDUCTING BUSINESS WITH INNOVATIVE CASINO PRODUCTS

- WHEREAS, the Tribe's status as a federally-recognized Indian tribe was reaffirmed and restored by Congress pursuant to Public Law 103-324, 108 Stat. 2156 (25 U.S.C.§ 1300k et seq.); and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on July 11, 2016 which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on August 24, 2016; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(I) to take action, not inconsistent with the Constitution or Federal law, which is necessary and proper to carry out the sovereign powers of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has in Gaming Commission Ordinance #04-400-04, created a Gaming Commission and delegated to such Commission the authority to regulate all gaming activities authorized by the Tribe and to enforce all Tribal, federal, and applicable state laws governing the conduct of gaming conducted on the Tribe's reservation; and
- WHEREAS, in Section 6.01 of Gaming Commission Ordinance, the Gaming Commission is authorized to promulgate rules and regulations as may be necessary to interpret and implement the NIGC and Tribal Council approved Gaming Ordinance #10-400-01 and to establish regulatory systems to effectuate the powers granted by ordinances of the Tribe and other duties imposed by applicable law; and

- WHEREAS, the Gaming Ordinance Article VIII Section 8.04 states that no vendor shall contract with any gaming enterprise within the jurisdiction of the Tribe unless licensed by the regulatory agency in accordance with Article XI (Vendor License); and
- WHEREAS, Chapter 6 Section 3-1 of the Tribal Council approved Gaming
 Commission regulations states that every person supplying any gaming equipment
 or supplies, gaming service, or other goods and services to a gaming enterprise
 must obtain a Gaming Vendor License or a Non-Gaming Vendor License unless
 exempted from licensing requirements pursuant to Section 3-4 or Section 3-5 or
 meeting the definition of Service Vendor; and
- WHEREAS, Chapter 6 Section 3-2 of the Tribal Council approved Gaming Commission regulations states that the gaming enterprise shall be responsible for notifying any person with which it is considering conducting business of the licensing requirements prior to contracting with such person; and
- WHEREAS, Chapter 6 Section 3-3 of the Tribal Council approved Gaming Commission regulations states that prior to the purchase of any gaming equipment or supplies, gaming service, or other goods and services from any person, the gaming enterprise shall determine if such person possesses or is required to possess, a Gaming Vendor License or Non-Gaming Vendor License under these regulations and forward a written "Notice of Intent to Conduct Business" to the Gaming Commission. The "Notice of Intent to Conduct Business" shall describe the equipment, supplies or services to be provided by the vendor, together with a good faith estimate of the annual dollar amount of the projected purchases from the vendor. The gaming enterprise may not commit to any binding contracts or business transactions until the vendor has been licensed; and
- WHEREAS, Innovative Casino Products who is a licensed Non-Gaming Vendor has not returned their renewal application associated with the renewal process; and therefore, the vendor's license will expire January 19, 2017 at 12:00 a.m.

NOW THEREFORE IT IS ORDERED that the Little River Casino Resort shall cease conducting business with Innovative Casino Products effective January 19, 2017 at 12:00 a.m. until such time that they meet the licensing requirement in accordance to Tribal law and regulations.
