Boozhoo LRBOI Elder Designated Housing Department Tenants.

Dear Head of Household:

At the July Housing Commission monthly meeting the Housing Commission approved Resolution # 18-0809-04, Resolution to establish the maximum allotted amount of water that the Housing Department will pay for in Elder Designated Housing. Resolution #18-0809-04 is attached to this letter for your review.

Whereas the Utilities Department determined that the average use of water in Elder designated housing is 5000 gallons per unit, per month, the Housing Commission has established this allowance for continued free service.

Effective October 1, 2018, the Housing Department will only be paying up to 5000 gallons per unit, per month. If the unit goes over the maximum allowed amount, the tenant will be responsible for paying the difference to the Housing Department. Tenants will be provided with an invoice documenting usage with a bill for any amount over 5000 gallons. This bill will be due with the next months rent. There is no need for further action by any tenant and no need to contact the Utilities Department. For those tenants that are curious about their use and would like a record of use for planning future expenses, please contact the Housing Department and we will assist you.

Approval to Submit to Tribal Council the FY2019 Indian Housing Plan for the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians as Developed by the Housing Department

- WHEREAS, the status of the Gaá Čhíng Ziíbi Daáwaa Aníšhinaábek (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians established the Little River Band Housing Commission, Housing Commission Ordinance #04-700-01; and
- WHEREAS, the Housing Ordinance authorizes the Housing Commission to develop and adopt regulations governing Tribal Housing on Tribal Trust or fee lands. Housing Commission Ordinance, Section 6.01(a); and

- WHEREAS, the Tribe is required to submit a Tribal Indian Housing Plan to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development on an annual basis, the submittal of which provides to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development the basis of allocating NAHASDA funding through the Indian Housing Block Grant; and
- WHEREAS, this submittal is due to U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development no later than October 17, 2018 for the fiscal year 2019; and
- WHEREAS, the FY2019 Indian Housing Plan also provides both program descriptions and budgets for the identified plan which are allowable activities through the Indian Housing Block Grant and does serve the long term interest of the Housing Department, the Tribe and its members.
- WHEREAS, the Housing Department readied this submission to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development which was reviewed by the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians Housing Commission;

IT IS NOW THEREFORE RESOLVED THAT the Housing Commission of the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians whereby approves the submission of the 2019 Indian Housing Plan to Tribal Council for approval and submission to U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development no later than October 17, 2018.

I. Housing Activities.

- A. The Construction of the two four-bedroom Fair Market rentals at Aki are progressing nicely. Lot 51 the painting is complete and the cabinets are in, Lot 52 the drywall is hung and cabinets are being installed. The landscaping for the Aki 10 and these two units is scheduled to start first of September.
- **B.** The Elder Housing Project came in over budget and with some hard decisions and a lot of discussion from Tom St. Dennis, Marcella Leusby, Travois Architects, Wieland and myself we accomplished getting the project under budget, so the contractor will be breaking ground the first week in September.
- **C.** I met twice this month with Elise McGowan-Cuellar, Staff Attorney and Bill Willis, Members Services Lead.
- **D.** I attended two Tribal Council work session this month, for setting of the rental rates for the two-four bedroom homes and housing commission suggested changes to the Aki maadiziwin Building Ordinance.
- **E.** The Housing Department sent out correspondence to the Elder Designed Homes advising them of the new maximum allotted amount of water usage per month that the department will pay for starting October 1, 2018, along with a copy of the Housing Commission Resolution.
- F. Tammy Burmeister, Grants Coordinator, Bill Willis, Members Services Lead, Chad Gehrke, Grants Clerk and myself attend a two day ONAP training for EPIC (Energy and Performance Information Center) held at the Aki maaiziwin Community Center Conference room to learn the new electronic format for the Indian Housing Plan and Annual Performance Report.
- **G.** The department mailed out to all Aki tenants an informational newsletter
- **H.** During the month the Department performed the following activities.

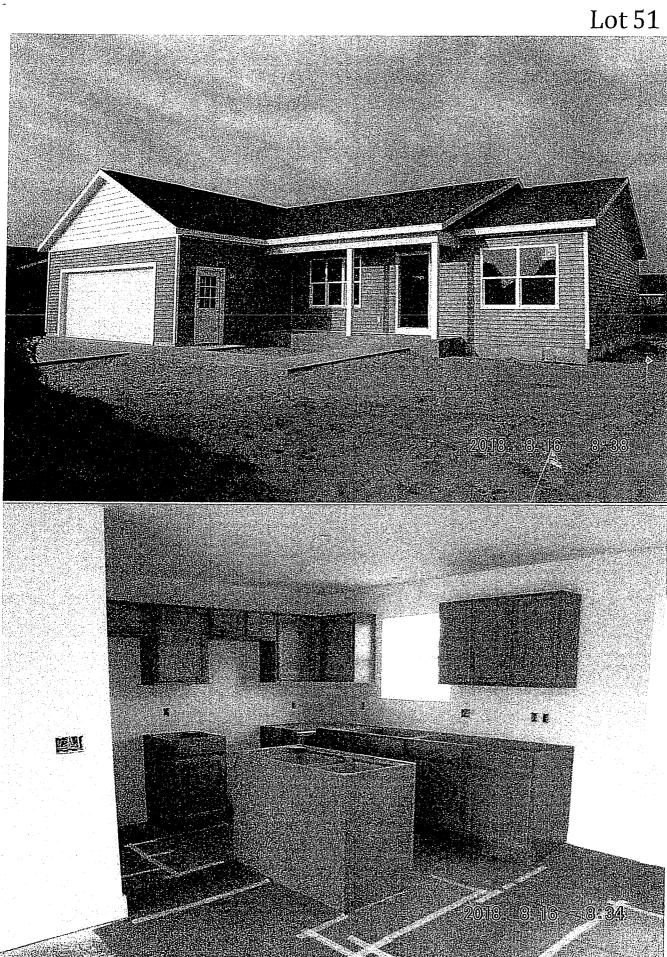

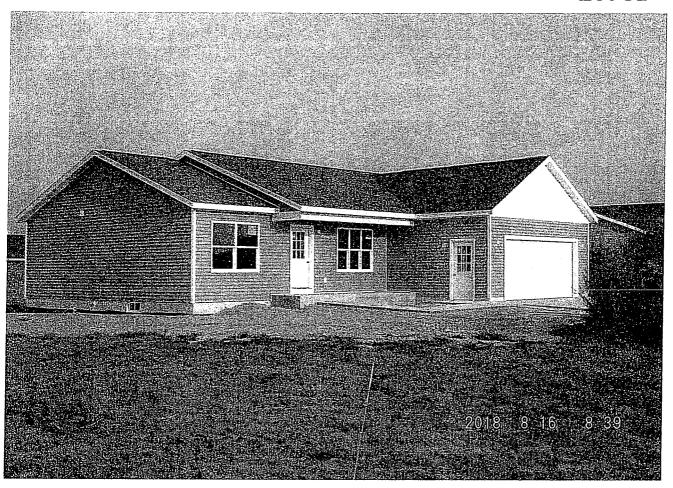

What Should I Expect If the Tribal Housing Department Seeks to Evict Me?

Chapter 4 of the Housing Regulations governs evictions from tribal public housing at LRB. If the tenant fails to comply with the notice of termination within 20 days by paying the rent due, entering into a payment plan, or moving out, the Housing Department may start a lawsuit in tribal court to ask the court to evict the tenant. The Housing Department may agree to withdraw the petition if the tenant pays the entire amount owed or enters into a payment agreement. After notice and a hearing, the court can enter an order of eviction. The Housing Department may request assistance from the Public Safety Department to execute an eviction judgment. Housing Regulations Ch. 4 § 5.

Filing a Complaint or Requesting a Hearing with the Housing Commission.

If a tenant disagrees with any final action or decision of the Housing Director, the tenant may follow the procedures in section 6.03 of the Housing Commission Ordinance to request an appeal.

The Housing Commission sits as the hearing body for tenant grievances. The Commission's decisions can be appealed to the tribal court. The tenant must pay rent while any appeal is pending. Housing Regulations Ch. 4 § 10.

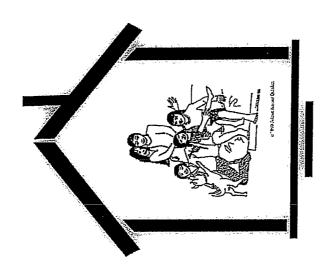

Sources of Law

As a federally recognized tribe, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians ("LRB") is a sovereign nation. Indian tribes are able to create their own laws concerning property on reservation. This can cause laws and procedures to be different than other tribes and the State of Michigan. LRB's tribal public housing is regulated by a federal law called the Native American Housing Assistance and Self Determination Act ("NAHASDA"), as well as LRB's Housing Commission Ordinance #04-700-01 and Chapters 1-7 of the Housing Regulations. NAHASDA gives tribes freedom to create their own rules for tribal housing, but provides some specific protections for tenants, such as capping the rent at 30% of the family's income.

Can I Be Kicked Out of My Home Without a Court Hearing?

No. The landlord must go through the court process and get an eviction order before the tenant can be forced to leave the home.

What Is a Lease?

A lease is an agreement that legally binds both the landlord and the tenant to the terms for a specified period of time. The terms usually define the obligations of the parties and what happens if the terms are violated. The lease may be oral or written but oral agreements may be impossible to prove in court if a dispute arises.

What Is a Security Deposit?

A security deposit, sometimes called a damage deposit, is money given to the landlord to ensure rent will be paid and to cover the cost of repair if the tenant damages the property. The security deposit is different from other deposits given for the first and/or last month's rent, which the landlord keeps. The landlord may keep the security deposit for damages caused by the tenant, however, normal wear and tear is not deductible. If the deposit is not enough to cover all damages, then the tenant may be held responsible for additional costs.

What Are the Tenant's Responsibilities?

Chapter 3, section 4-5, of the Housing Regulations outlines some of the basic rules for tribal housing occupants. The lease agreement also contains rules that the tenant must follow.

Some examples include:

- Pay rent on time
- Keep the property clean and tidy
 - Do not damaging the property
- Avoid unlawful and other disruptive behavior
- Use the home as a principal residence
- Do not use the home for a business purpose without permission
- Notify the Housing Department if a visitor will be staying for more than 3 days
- Follow the rules in Chapter 6 of the Housing Regulations regarding pet ownership
- Notify the Housing Department in writing within 10 days if the person listed as Head of Household on the lease no longer lives in the home

How Do I Terminate My Tribal Public Housing Lease?

The tenant may terminate the lease by giving 30 days' written notice to the Housing Department and following any other procedures stated in the lease. Housing Regulations Ch. 3 § 4-3.

When Can My Landlord Terminate My Tribal Public Housing Lease?

The Housing Department can terminate a lease agreement if the tenant violates any lease term. Examples include: failure to pay rent, failure to report household or income changes to the Housing Department within 7 days, and drug related criminal activity. Depending on the specific violation, the Housing Department may give the tenant time to fix the problem or simply terminate the lease by sending a notice of termination. Housing Regulations Ch. 3 § 4.

When the Housing Department seeks to terminate a tenancy for failure to pay rent, two notices must be served on the tenant. First, the notice of delinquency gives the tenant 7 days to pay the rent due or enter into a payment plan. If the tenant fails to do this, they will receive a notice of termination giving them 20 days to pay the rent due, enter into a payment plan, or move out. The notice of termination must be hand delivered or sent by certified mail. Housing Regulations Ch. 4 § 4.
