- **C.** Michelle Pepera attended Great Lakes Indian Housing Association Meeting in Minneapolis, MN November 17-21, 2019 as a representative of Little River Band Housing Department has been quite a while since we have attended one of these quarterly meetings.
- **D.** I have been looking for new housing software to automate many processes done in the housing department.
- E. The department met three times this month with Elise McGowan-Cuellan, Staff Attorney and Bill Willis, Members Services Lead. And continue to work on updating policies to bring forth to the Housing Commission for review, input and approval.

A. Please see the attached daily log kept by the Housing Maintenance Technicians. This log is not intended to be an in depth description of the work performed each day, but instead a snap shot of their daily activities. We currently have 7 outstanding work orders for annual inspections.

### IV. Number of Units and Vacancies.

LRBOI Housing Department has 79 rental units in total of which 75 were rented giving us an occupancy rating of 95%.

- **A.** Aki has 55 income based rental units of which 52 were rented during the month as follows:
  - 1. Aki has 9 low income elder designated rental units and 9 units are rented.
  - 2. Aki has 2 low income elder ADA designated rental units and 2 are rented.
  - 3. Aki has 28 low-income family rental units and 27 are rented.
  - 4. Aki has 6 low income family ADA rental units and 6 are rented.
  - 5. Aki has 10 low income elder designated apartment rental units and 8 units are rented. —
- B. Aki has 24 Fair Market rentals and 23 are rented.

- A. Working on replacement of the 12 Elder's back decking Four units have been completed.
- B. The maintenance department has been busy keep the housing areas clear of snow including plowing for ADA designated rental units and Elders.

Resolution # 19- 1205 - 58

### Resolution Approving Changes to Chapter 6 of the Housing Commission Regulations

- WHEREAS, the status of the *Gaá Čhíng Ziíbi Daáwaa Aníšhinaábek* (Little River Band of Ottawa Indians) as a sovereign and Treaty-making power is confirmed in numerous treaties, from agreements with the initial colonial powers on this land, to various treaties with the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians (Tribe) is descended from, and is the political successor to, the Grand River Ottawa Bands, signatories of the 1836 Treaty of Washington (7 Stat. 491) with the United States, as reaffirmed by federal law in P.L. 103-324, enacted in 1994; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted a new Constitution, pursuant to a vote of the membership on May 27, 1998, which Constitution became effective upon its approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on July 10, 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on April 26, 2004, which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on May 13, 2004; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe adopted amendments to the Constitution on July 11, 2016 which became effective upon approval by the Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs on August 24, 2016; and
- WHEREAS, the legislative powers of the Little River Band are vested in the Tribal Council at Article IV, Section 7 of the Constitution; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(a) of the Constitution to enact ordinances and adopt resolutions to provide for the public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare of the Little River Band and its members and to govern the conduct of members of the Little River Band and other persons within its jurisdiction; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is authorized under Article IV, Section 7(f) to create by ordinance regulatory commissions or subordinate organizations and to delegate to such organizations the power to manage the affairs of the Little River Band; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council did by Ordinance #04-700-01 create the Housing Commission to oversee and regulate the Tribe's housing with the delegated power in Section 6.01(a) of

that ordinance to develop and adopt regulations governing Tribal housing on Tribal trust or fee lands.

WHEREAS, the Housing Commission identified in the normal course of review of their regulations that Chapter 6, Pet and Animal Control Regulations for Tribal Rental Units requires formatting and stylistic updates and updates based on issues identified by the Housing Department; and

WHEREAS, the Housing Commission determined that the definition of pet required updating and the definition of service animal was necessary, updating the Authorization sections for cats and dogs to include the failure to register a pet with the Housing Department will result in a non-refundable fee every month the pet is not registered and on a yearly basis pet proof of vaccinations and a photograph of the pet shall be provided to the Housing Department, clarifying that the Housing Department has discretion to enter a home for maintenance if an animal is not restrained or caged, clarifying that pets cannot be left unattended or tied to the residence when they are outside or left unattended in a vehicle and in danger, additions to Peaceful Enjoyment allowing the removal of a pet or issuance of a citation if the pet disturbs peaceful enjoyment and the Head of Household has not complied with the Housing Department, the addition of Disturbance of Peace to allow public safety the ability to issue citations, and a section on Service Animals.

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED that the Housing Commission approves the redlined changes adopting the above mentioned changes.

IT IS FINALLY RESOLVED that the Housing Commission shall forward this resolution to Tribal Council for adoption.
