7. Business: Elise, our lawyer, informed us that Council made a motion to post a 30 day comment to remove non-tribal from being on the commissions. They want to amend the Commission Ordinance, Council also want to let 18 year olds on the commissions. Non-tribal on the commissions can finish serving out their term.

Our main concern at this meeting are changes made to Chapter 6. Because of the increase of complaints and a dangerous dog complaint the Commission thought it best to update and make new changes as soon as possible to Chapter 6. Our Tribal Police will have access to ticket or remove an animal from Aki. Elise will bring the new additions to the November 7 meeting.

Commission made new rules on what pedigree of dog will be allowed and weight restriction of no more than 50 pounds.

Tom Guenthardt bought up the issue of leaving dogs in parked cars. Commission has decided to rule that no dogs will be kept in a vehicle, if reported and found person will be ticketed and animal can be removed. Service animals will be limited to cats and dogs. No livestock or any other form such as reptile or insect of any kind will be allowed at Aki housing.

9. Public Comment: Comment was bought up that Mike Ceplina let the HC know there was mold in their basement. Julia Chapman reported she saw people smoking in the children's playground area.
