## HOUSING DEPARTMENT:

The Tribally funded Down payment and Closing Cost Assistance program has been funded for this year, 2016. Tribal Citizens can receive up to a combined maximum of \$5,000.00. The combined maximum is based on 2.33% for the down payment assistance up to \$3,500 and 1.00% for closing cost assistance up to \$1,500. The assistance is calculated on the total purchase price and the eligibility criteria highlights are as follows.

1. Must be an enrolled member of LRBOI.
2. Must be at least 21 years old.
3. Must not currently own a home/residence.
4. Residence must be the borrower's permanent primary residence.
5. Must not have previously accessed funds under this or any other Tribal program that provides down payment and closing cost assistance.
6. Must be a single family residence.

## RESULTS OF ELECTION

Little River Band of Ottawa Indians  
July 11, 2016

Attached are the Certificates of Results of Election for the Secretarial (BIA) Election held July 11, 2016 regarding the adoption or rejection of seven proposed Amendments A – G to the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians' Tribal Constitution.

In accordance with 25 CFR § 81.43: Any person who was listed on the Eligible Voters List and who submitted a voter registration form may challenge the results of the Secretarial election. The written challenge, with substantiating evidence, must be received by the Chairman of the Secretarial Election Board within 5 days after the Certificate of Results of Election is posted, not including the day the Certificate of Results of Election is posted. Challenges received after the deadline for filing challenges will not be considered. If the fifth day falls on a weekend or Federal holiday, the challenge must be received by close of business on the next business day.

A challenge to this election must be received by the Chair of the Election Board by the close of business July 18, 2016.
